CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENT

This year we have a lot to be thankful for and celebrate, as our NCEA results are positive. We are very proud of the students that have worked hard in 2018 to gain these results. Below are the 2018 NCEA results:

Students achieving NCEA Level 1 – 84.6%* Students achieving NCEA Level 2 – 71.8%*

Students achieving NCEA Level 3 – 71.7%*

Level 1 Literacy – 96.2%

Level 1 Numeracy – 92.3%

*Statistics based on the cumulative overall results, however our participation (students who started and finished the school year with us) statistics are higher and showed that at all levels our students were achieving higher than the national averages.

On Monday, 25th of February, we will celebrate the success of our high achievers in Level 1, 2 and 3. These students attained NCEA Merit and Excellence endorsements for their work last year. 
PRAYER WALK

MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT

The ASDAH Mathematics Department would like to welcome all students, families and caregivers into Maths learning 2019. Throughout the year there will be various activities and initiatives both in and out of the classroom that will improve student motivation and learning in Mathematics. This will include participation in Mathex and the Australian Maths Competition.

Results from last year include an increase in Numeracy at Level 1 as well as outstanding achievement from Braxton Sampson, Jessica Ryan and Roki Pulini, Merit endorsement at Level 1, Saraphina Teariki and Paula Finau, Merit endorsement at L2 and Siosifa Lua, merit endorsement at Level 3.

This year in the junior school students at year 10 will again sit two Level 1 NCEA achievement standards.

In the senior school all classes are well into their learning with several courses doing assessments over the next 2-3 weeks. Year 10 will complete their first Achievement Standard by week 6. All students have course outlines detailing Topics and the dates of respective assessments.


All students are set homework in Maths, the amount of which depends on at what level they are studying. In the senior school it is particularly important that homework is completed. Families, caregivers must allocate time and resources at home for students to achieve this.

PLEASE NOTE:

At both years 9 and 10 all students should have a workbook, these cost \$25. In the senior school students will be issued with several workbooks through the year at a total cost of \$30 for the year. If you have not already done so, please pay at the school office.

In the 2mat1 and 3mat1 courses graphics calculators are essential. These are available from the school for \$80, significantly less than the retail price.

GEOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT

Late last year (November 7, 2018), Monte Fleming, a geology student of the Department of Earth and Biological Sciences of the SDA Loma Linda University in Los Angeles, USA, presented some of his research data at the annual meeting of the Geological Society of America. The annual meeting of the Geological Society took place in Indianapolis, Indiana. The student was co-supervised by Dr Cornelis Bootsman, the geography teacher at ASDAH. The poster presentation was entitled 'Possible Fluvial Origin of Potholes on Rock Window Mesa in Chinle Valley, Arizona. The contributing authors were Monte Fleming, Leonard Brand, Norman Moll, and Cornelis Bootsman. Dr Bootsman assisted the student with the geomorphological fieldwork for his thesis research project.



A helicopter was used for some of the fieldwork in Arizona, USA during Dr. Bootsman's visits.

FIRST AID AND HEALTH & SAFETY COURSE



The first week of February saw 51 Year 12 students complete their First Aid Certificate and a Health & Safety Certificate. The course was run by Actions for Survival and at the end of three days students had earned eight credits towards NCEA (Level 1, 2 & 3).

DRIVER LICENCE SCHOLARSHIP



ADRA and Let's Get Legal have been working on a project to assist more secondary students licensed and legal on our roads and to help them improve their opportunities in education, employment and to gain their independence.

10 ASDAH students will have their Learner Licence test fees paid by ADRA but only the first 7 students to pass their Learners **by 14 April 2019** will be eligible to progress to stage 2 to receive:

- Free download of the Practical Restricted Licence APP.
- ◆ Free AA Membership includes 3 professional driving lessons (under ignition youth program).
- ♦ Restricted Licence test fee paid.



These 7 students will then have until the 17 November to sit the official Restricted licence test.

Students who pass their restricted driving license test will then be eligible to receive:

• Defensive Driving course paid. (This will cut down the time required to get a full licence)

Students will have until the 20th December to complete it. This date can be extended if needed and pending the students circumstances.

To qualify students must:

- ♦ Turn 16 by 1st March
- ♦ Attend a lunchtime meeting Monday 25 February in the library
- Return the required forms signed by parents with the correct ID to Ms Duckett Tuesday morning. Only the first 10 students will be eligible.

This is an excellent opportunity for students but they will need to take the responsibility of finding time to study (3-4 hours online) and to sit the test at VTNZ or the AA. Ms Duckett will available only at certain times to take a limited number of students to VTNZ.

LEARNER LICENCE CLASSES

There will be other Learner Licence classes this year (dates to be confirmed.

70% require an applicant to have a Drivers License


Classes run after school in the library from 3.30 - 4.30. Ms Duckett will be teaching the class. The cost is \$94 (the cost of the test).



We are lucky enough to have sponsorship for 15 students (leftover from 2018) who will receive a \$50 refund paid into a bank account when they present their Learner Licence to Ms Duckett.

Students need to see Ms Duckett to enrol for these classes.

RESTRICTED DRIVER LICENCE

At this stage ASDAH does not offer a Restricted Licence programme.

AUCKLAND RESTRICTED DRIVER LICENCE WORKSHOPS

Attend a free 3 hour workshop plus receive a free practical driving assessment (valued at \$80) to see if you are ready to sit the test.

Have you held a learner licence for more than 6 months? Are you between the ages of 16 and 24? Auckland Transport is excited to present "Restricted Licence" workshops available to our Auckland communities. These workshops will provide you with the information you need to know before sitting your restricted licence test. We will go over the do's and don'ts of the testing process to help give you confidence.

To apply for our restricted workshops you must have held your learner licence for at least 6 months.


